2024 Scored Colorado Legislation

Emergency Planning (HB 24-1033)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of HB24-1033, which requires local governments to develop and maintain emergency management plans that support people with companion animals.

Sponsor: Sen. Lisa Cutter (D), Sen. Sonya Jaquez Lewis (D), Rep. Marc Snyder (D), and Rep. Elizabeth Velasco (D)

Status: Passed both chambers and was signed by the Governor on April 11th, 2024.

Division of Animal Welfare (HB24-1458)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of HB24-1458, which creates a division to promote domestic animal welfare within Colorado's Department of Agriculture.

Sponsors: Sen. Dylan Roberts (D), Sen. Rachel Zenzinger (D), Rep. Ryan Armagost (R), and Rep. Monica Duran (D)

Status: Passed both chambers and was signed by the Governor on May 30th, 2024.

Wolverine Restoration (SB24-171)

A ✓ indicates a vote in favor of SB24-171, which reintroduces wolverines—an iconic North American species—to Colorado.

Sponsor: Sen. Dylan Roberts (D), Sen. Perry Will (R), Rep. Tisha Mauro (D), and Rep. Barbara McLachlan (D)

Status: Passed both chambers and was signed by the Governor on May 20th, 2024.

Humane Society Legislative Fund

The Humane Society Legislative Fund was formed in 2004 as a separate lobbying affiliate of The Humane Society of the United States. HSLF works to pass animal protection laws at the state and federal levels, to educate the public about animal protection issues, and to support humane candidates for office.
