How Scores Are Calculated

Many animal protection issues never receive a recorded vote in Congress. Some are enacted by voice vote, and some languish. To accurately measure legislators' support, we count not just recorded votes but other meaningful ways they can help issues advance, such as cosponsoring key bills and cosigning letters seeking increased enforcement of animal welfare laws. Scores are given as percentages of the number of items counted. Prime sponsors of legislation also receive "extra credit" equal to one vote or cosponsorship, unless they already had a score of 100—in that case, their scores appear in bold with a plus sign.

HSLF acknowledges the limitations of judging legislators based on a few votes, cosponsorships, and joint letters. In some cases, legislators must miss votes for unavoidable personal reasons, such as a death in the family, serious illness, or birth of a child. Please also consider such unrecorded matters as performance on committees and constituent service.

111th Congress Tackles Animal Cruelty



Dear Friends,

Animals won important victories in the 111th Congress, despite the challenges of moving legislation forward in an often-fraught atmosphere. These priority bills completed in the last month of the session—which ran from January 2009 to December 2010—showed that lawmakers can indeed reach bipartisan agreement to protect animals:

Animal Crush Video Prohibition Act: On Dec. 9, 2010, a new law (P.L. 111-294) took effect banning the creation, sale, and distribution of obscene videos that show the intentional crushing, burning, drowning, suffocating, or impaling of live animals—often by women in stiletto

heels—for the sexual gratification of viewers. When federal courts struck down a 1999 law intended to ban such videos, we saw a resurgence in their sale on the Internet. Less than eight months after the Supreme Court ruling, outstanding leadership by congressional champions spurred enactment of a narrowly crafted bill to stop the trade.

Truth in Fur Labeling Act: On Dec. 18, 2010, P.L. 111-313 was enacted, bringing much-needed accuracy and disclosure to the sale of fur-trimmed products. Prior law allowed fur content to be unidentified if valued at \$150 or less, and HSUS investigations found widespread deception in the market, including garments trimmed with animal fur being falsely advertised as faux fur.

Shark Conservation Act: On Jan. 4, 2011, P.L. 111-348 was signed into law, ending within U.S. waters the cruel and unsustainable practice of finning: cutting off sharks' fins and tossing the mutilated animals back into the ocean to die, just to supply the market for shark fin soup. Finning is a major cause of massive declines in shark populations around the world, as well as serious imbalances in ocean ecosystems that revolve around these top predators. The new law closes loopholes in a previous ban that have allowed domestic shark finning to continue, and it strengthens the hand of U.S. negotiators in pressing other countries to pursue meaningful shark conservation.

There were other successes besides these three, from a major food safety law that could help ensure safer pet food to a law calling for a new postal stamp to benefit wildlife conservation. And congressional action encouraged important steps by the Obama Administration, such as preservation of the international whaling moratorium, a looming end to the pet trade in large constrictor snakes, and reforms to improve humane slaughter enforcement.

Unfortunately, a host of other worthwhile measures did not get finished before Congress adjourned, such as urgently needed funding to enforce a ban on the cruel soring of show horses, plus bills to end pet trade in primates, help rescue stranded marine mammals, strengthen penalties for egregious intentional violations of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, and prohibit transporting horses in unsafe double-decker vehicles.

SENATE SCORED ITEMS

Climate Change/EPA

A ✓ indicates a vote against a joint resolution introduced by Sen. Lisa Murkowski, R-Alaska, to overturn the Environmental Protection Agency's 2009 finding that greenhouse gases threaten public health and welfare. The resolution would have impeded the EPA's authority to address climate change, which poses major threats to wildlife, pets, and all other animals. (Pro-animal vote: NO)

STATUS: Murkowski resolution failed 47-53 in June 2010

Guns in Parks

A ✓ indicates a vote against an amendment introduced by Sen. Tom Coburn, R-Okla., to a credit card reform bill. The amendment removed the long-standing federal ban on carrying loaded firearms in national parks. This prohibition had been an invaluable tool for park rangers to prevent wildlife poaching. (Pro-animal vote: NO)

STATUS: Coburn amendment passed 67-29 in May 2009; signed into law as part of P.L. 111-24

ESA Rule Repeal

A ✓ indicates a vote against an amendment offered by Sen. Lisa Murkowski, R-Alaska, to the fiscal 2009 Omnibus Appropriations Act. The amendment would have stripped language authorizing the Obama Administration to expeditiously withdraw damaging Endangered Species Act rules issued in the final days of the Bush Administration. (Pro-animal vote: NO)



STATUS: Murkowski amendment failed 42-52 in March 2009; P.L. 111-8 signed into law with good ESA language intact; Obama Administration rescinded Bush ESA rules in May 2009

Puppy Mills

A ✓ indicates cosponsorship of S. 3424 to close a loophole in the Animal Welfare Act that allows large-scale commercial dog breeders to evade oversight. The bill would have required licensing and inspection of commercial breeders who sell 50 or more puppies per year online and directly to the public. It would also have required that all breeding dogs at commercial facilities be provided daily exercise.

SPONSORS: Sens. Richard Durbin, D-Ill.; David Vitter, R-La.

STATUS: No committee action; 20 cosponsors

Horse Slaughter

A ✓ indicates cosponsorship of S. 727 to prohibit the knowing and intentional possession, transport, purchase, sale, delivery, and receipt of horses to be slaughtered for human consumption. This ban would have covered purchase by "killer buyers" and cruel long-distance hauls to Mexican and Canadian slaughterhouses that cater to European and Asian markets.

SPONSORS: Sens. Mary Landrieu, D-La.; John Ensign, R-Nev.

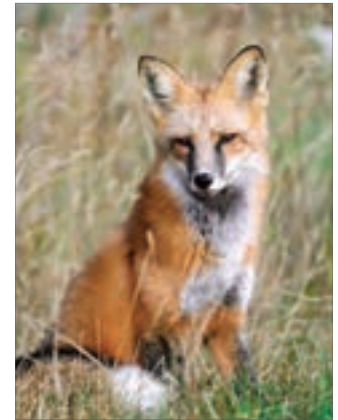
STATUS: No committee action; 29 cosponsors

Fur Labeling

A ✓ indicates cosponsorship of S. 1076 to require species labeling on all fur products regardless of value, closing a loophole in current law. This measure will help consumers make informed choices and combat the import of dog and cat fur.

SPONSORS: Sens. Robert Menendez, D-N.J.; Susan Collins, R-Maine; David Vitter, R-La. (House companion bill, H.R. 2480, introduced by Reps. Jim Moran, D-Va.; Mary Bono Mack, R-Calif.; Ed Whitfield, R-Ky.)

STATUS: Signed into law, with 34 Senate and 171 House cosponsors, P. L. 111-313, in December 2010



Antibiotics Overuse

A ✓ indicates cosponsorship of S. 619 to phase out routine nontherapeutic use of antibiotics in animal feed. This reckless practice serves as a crutch to support overcrowded, stressful, unsanitary conditions on factory farms, and it undermines the effectiveness of antibiotics for treating sick people and animals.

SPONSORS: Sens. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass.; Olympia Snowe, R-Maine; Dianne Feinstein, D-Calif.

STATUS: No committee action; 19 cosponsors

Chimpanzees in Research

A ✓ indicates cosponsorship of S. 3694 to phase out use of chimpanzees in invasive research and codify the NIH moratorium on breeding these animals for invasive research. The bill would have also retired to sanctuary the approximately 500 federally owned chimpanzees currently languishing in six U.S. laboratories at great taxpayer expense. These animals are mostly unused in active research because chimpanzees have proven to be poor research models for human illness.

SPONSORS: Sens. Maria Cantwell, D-Wash.; Susan Collins, R-Maine; Bernard Sanders, I-Vt.

STATUS: No committee action; 6 cosponsors

Funding Letter

A ✓ indicates that a member was one of 40 Senators who cosigned a group letter to the Agriculture Appropriations Subcommittee (or submitted an individual request) in March 2010 seeking funds for enforcement of the Humane Methods of Slaughter Act, Animal Welfare Act, Horse Protection Act, and federal animal fighting law. The letter also sought funds for programs to address the needs of animals in disasters and to ease a shortage of veterinarians in rural and inner-city areas and public health practice through student loan forgiveness.

SPONSORS: Sens. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif.; David Vitter, R-La.

STATUS: Requested funding approved in committee but lost when Congress passed Continuing Resolution in lieu of regular appropriations bills in December 2010

HOUSE SCORED ITEMS

Animal "Crush" Videos

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 5566 to ban interstate and foreign commerce in obscene crush videos showing the intentional crushing, burning, drowning, suffocating, or impaling of puppies, kittens, or other live animals for the sexual titillation of viewers. The legislation was introduced in response to the Supreme Court's April 2010 ruling in *U.S. v. Stevens*, which struck down a 1999 animal cruelty depictions law as "overbroad" but left open a pathway for Congress to pass a more narrowly focused law aimed at animal crush videos.

SPONSORS: Reps. Elton Gallegly, R-Calif.; Gary Peters, D-Mich. (Senate companion bill, S. 3841, introduced by Sens. Jon Kyl, R-Ariz.; Jeff Merkley, D-Ore.; Richard Burr, R-N.C.)

STATUS: Signed into law, P. L. 111-294, in December 2010

Service Dogs for Veterans

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 3885 to establish a program at Veterans Administration medical centers in which patients with post-deployment mental health issues such as post-traumatic stress disorder would train service dogs as a form of therapy, and the trained dogs would assist veterans with disabilities. The program would have also assessed the effectiveness of dog training as a therapeutic method for these patients.

SPONSOR: Rep. Henry Brown, R-S.C.

STATUS: Passed House 403-4 in May 2010

Factory Farms/Climate Change

A ✓ indicates a vote against a motion by Rep. Mike Simpson, R-Idaho, to uphold an amendment (offered in committee by Rep. Tom Latham, R-Iowa) to the fiscal 2010 Interior Department appropriations bill. The amendment barred the Environmental Protection Agency from proceeding with plans to collect greenhouse gas emissions data from the largest factory farms. (Pro-animal vote: NO)

STATUS: Simpson motion passed House 267-147 in October 2009; amendment retained in final appropriations bill signed into law, P.L. 111-88, in October 2009



Marine Turtles

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 509 to authorize an additional five years of grants for marine turtle conservation projects in foreign countries, expand eligibility to include projects in the U.S., and increase authorized funding levels.

SPONSORS: Reps. Henry Brown, R-S.C.; Madeleine Bordallo, D-Guam

STATUS: Passed House 354-72 in July 2009; passed Senate Environment and Public Works Committee in December 2009

Sea Otters

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 556 to establish a more effective recovery program for the severely declining population of Southern sea otters.

SPONSOR: Rep. Sam Farr, D-Calif. (Senate companion bill, S. 1748, introduced by Sen. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif.)

STATUS: Passed House 316-107 in July 2009; S. 1748 was brought up for unanimous approval in the Senate but did not pass

Wild Horses

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 1018 to restore the prohibition on the commercial sale and slaughter of wild free-roaming horses and burros, and replace the current system of roundups and warehousing in holding facilities with more humane, effective, and fiscally responsible management practices, such as adoptions, sanctuaries, and birth control.

SPONSORS: Reps. Nick Rahall, D-W.Va.; Raúl Grijalva, D-Ariz. (Senate companion bill, S. 1579, introduced by Sen. Robert Byrd, D-W.Va.)

STATUS: Passed House 239-185 in July 2009



Guns in Parks

A ✓ indicates a vote against an amendment, introduced by Sen. Tom Coburn, R-Okla., to a credit card reform bill. The amendment removed the long-standing federal ban on carrying loaded firearms in national parks. This prohibition had been an invaluable tool for park rangers to prevent wildlife poaching. (Pro-animal vote: NO)

SPONSOR: Rep. Carolyn McCarthy, D-N.Y., led the fight in the House against the Coburn amendment

STATUS: Coburn amendment upheld in House 279-147 in May 2009 and signed into law as part of P.L. 111-24

Great Cats and Rare Canids

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 411 to fund conservation programs that protect rare dog and cat species outside North America and Europe, such as jaguars, leopards, cheetahs, and African wild dogs.

SPONSOR: Rep. Jay Inslee, D-Wash. (Senate companion bill, S. 529, introduced by Sens. Joe Lieberman, I-Conn.; Sam Brownback, R-Kan.)

STATUS: Passed House 290-118 in April 2009; S. 529 was brought up for unanimous approval in the Senate but did not pass



Cranes

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 388 to fund conservation programs for imperiled crane populations in the U.S. and around the world.

SPONSOR: Rep. Tammy Baldwin, D-Wis. (Senate companion bill, S. 197, introduced by Sens. Russ Feingold, D-Wis.; Mike Crapo, R-Idaho)

STATUS: Passed House 288-116 in April 2009; H.R. 388 was brought up for unanimous approval in the Senate but did not pass

Primates as Pets

A ✓ indicates a vote for H.R. 80 to prohibit interstate and foreign commerce in primates for the pet trade. The bill would protect public health and safety and prevent inhumane treatment and neglect of these animals.

SPONSORS: Reps. Earl Blumenauer, D-Ore.; Mark Kirk, R-Ill. (Senate companion bill, S. 462, introduced by Sens. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif.; David Vitter, R-La.)

STATUS: Passed House 323-95 in February 2009; passed Senate Environment and Public Works Committee in May 2009

Puppy Mills

A ✓ indicates cosponsorship of H.R. 5434 to close a loophole in the Animal Welfare Act that allows large-scale commercial dog breeders to evade oversight. The bill would have required licensing and inspection of commercial breeders who sell 50 or more puppies per year online and directly to the public. It would have also required that all breeding dogs at commercial facilities be provided daily exercise.
